Welcome to term 2. We have hit the ground running with a busy start to the term and I anticipate the rest of the term will whizz by.

We only have a few more sleeps until camp. The students are very excited to go to an urban destination for a change. Thank you so much to all the parents and family members who have offered to come on camp to help transport and supervise, it wouldn't be possible without you. Please remember to label all your children's clothing and pack plenty of warm gear. We look forward to sharing our adventures with you all when we get back.

This term, all classes are focusing on cultures around the world for their inquiry. We are excited to share different cultures with our students through questioning, research, art, music and dance. We are looking forward to sharing our discoveries with you throughout our journey. If you have a specific culture that you are knowledgeable about, we would love to learn from you. I enjoy the outdoors and it gives me an opportunity to work while my kids are at school. I know a lot of the MGK students well as I have coached half of the boys at rugby.


What is your favourite sport and which teams do you support? My favourite sport is rugby league. I support the Warriors and all NZ sports teams.


