#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Maungakaramea Whānau

We have been very fortunate to have so many community members backing our school and giving up their valuable time to ensure our students have the best learning space possible. Over the past few weeks we have had our sand delivered by Gibbo (MJ & PJ Gibson Cartage) for our new sandpit that was built by Eric Dickinson and the local Mid Western Lions Club, project managed (kept in line!) by Lyn Dickinson and painted by Luana Misa and Jordan White. We have also had the huge pile of organic waste moved by Jane and Craig Anderson, with the help of Ray Lowe. Thank you so much to our amazing community who have helped us both on these and other projects. We are truly grateful for your support.

Thank you so much to everyone who came and met with our visitors from the Education Review Office last week. It was fantastic for ERO to get different perspectives on how the community feels our school is going and how parents feel their child's education is progressing. We have received oral feedback at the end of their week here, and this will be translated into a draft report in 4 - 6 weeks. We then have 15 working days to review this draft and provide evidence for differing facts if needed. After the draft is confirmed, we then receive another copy to review for 2 weeks, after this the report is available for the public. We will let you know as soon as this is available.

Attendance at school is vital to your child's academic progress. When a child attends school regularly, not only does it help their achievement levels, but also their social and emotional wellbeing in relation to learning and

interactions with others. When a child misses school, especially for multiple days they often lack confidence on their return and are also less inclined to take risks. Coming home today with this newsletter is a copy of our school policy on students attendance. As you will see in our policy, all absences are unjustified unless the student is too sick to attend school, or has suffered a bereavement. We do understand that there are a lot of bugs going around at the moment, and if your child is sick, the best place for them to be is at home resting. A main factor that is hindering attendance is holidays, please remember that these should only be taken during school holidays and if you need to take your child out of school during term time, you need to apply verbally or in writing. Any student who has less than 90% attendance this year will be contacted by the classroom teacher over the next week. If the attendance rate does not approve by the end of the term, this will be followed by a formal letter from the school explaining that we will need to look into referring the case to attendance services.

Don't forget, nominations for our Board of Trustees close at noon on Friday 24 May 2019. If you are interested in becoming a trustee or would like to know more about this, please come in and speak to myself or one of the current board members.

- Birthdays A big happy birthday to the lovely Winnie and our wonderful Jane. We hope you enjoy your special day!


