Last week, all of our teachers attended the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) conference in Auckland. This year, the PB4L conference theme was "Global initiative, local design. He kaupapa o te au, he whakatairanga a-rohe." Over the 2 days, there was a large focus on how New Zealand teachers, schools, students, parents and education community are adapting and localising Positive Behaviour for Learning – Schoolwide, into kiwi schools. We heard from external professionals including our keynote speakers Nathan Wallis, Sanja MacFarlane and George Sugai, who challenged our thinking and compared our practice with those around the globe. As we are in our second year of PB4L, we are always seeking ways to improve our practice, and this conference definitely equipped us with tools and knowledge to provide the best learning space to our changing educational world.

Thank you to everyone who purchased the school uniform on time, and make sure that your children are wearing it correctly everyday. We have also been receiving a lot of positive feedback from community members about how great it is to have a uniform now and how wonderful they look. 
