Dear Maungakaramea Whānau

I hope you had an amazing long weekend and enjoyed the taste of summer that the winterless North gifted us with.

Our students and teachers have been working hard this week to construct wonderful Country Day treasures. Thank you to all the parents, caregivers and grandparents who organised supplies to send along to this student led week. Please remember, you are not allowed into classrooms after school on Friday to view what your child has created, you must wait until our Country Day on Saturday.

Last week, our students were very lucky to have the opportunity to be visited by seven PHD students from Auckland University of Technology. The AUT team worked on a range of different science experiments with the students throughout the day. They had a great time making bottle rockets, looking at light and holograms, using static electricity and forces to make power, as well as looking at how hot and cold can shrink and expand different items. The students loved watching the AUT Crew play with liquid nitrogen and fruit! Thank you AUT, it was a fantastic day had by all.

As we move closer to the summer days, and as everyone is feeling a little tired, attendance often seems to slip. When students are well, it is important that they are at school, on time to make the most of their education. Research shows that higher student attendance at school is associated, on average, with higher student achievement. An 80% mark in many aspects of life may be good, but 80% attendance through four years of school equal a full school year lost. Not only is it important to attend school, but it is important to arrive on time, ready to start learning by 9am. Being five minutes late every day adds up to three days lost each year! Being on time means your child is not missing out on valuable learning and information from the teacher and time with their friends.

Thank you to everyone who has worked so hard on preparing the Country Day. We look forward to spending the day with you on Saturday, showcasing our wonderful school, talented students and supportive community.
