SCHOOL TIMES Our school day starts at 9.00am and finishes at 3.00pm. Pupils should not be at school before 8.15am. If they are being dropped off before 8.15am, please be aware that while there is staff present, they will not be directly supervised. It is important that pupils are at school before 9.00am so they do not miss roll call and the organisational information for their day. Teaching Times are: 9.00am - 10.30am 11.00am - 12.40pm 1.30pm - 3.00pm.

SCHOOL DONATION SCHEME The Board has opted in to the government donation scheme therefore in lieu of asking families for school donations, we receive \$150 per child. If the school opts in to the donations scheme, the board of trustees cannot ask you to make a donation unless it is for a school camp. If you choose not to make a donation, your child cannot be stopped from attending a camp if it is part of the school's core curriculum. Anyone can choose to make a donation to the school at any time. REMINDERS HATS - Please ensure your child has a school bucket hat at school. These are required to play outside and for afternoon sports activities. If they do not have a hat they must play in the shaded areas during break times. We would appreciate hats being named and kept in the classroom so each student knows where to find them. WHEELS DAY - Students are able to bring their bikes, skates, scooters, rollerblades or skateboards to school to use during break times.
