HEART FOUNDATION WORLD ORAL HEALTH DAY 20 March 2020 -Taking care of your mouth is important for your health and wellbeing. Good oral hygiene, regular dental check ups and a healthy diet will help protect your mouth. Top tips for a healthy smile include: Brush teeth twice a day for 2 minutes using a pea sized amount of fluoride toothpaste, brush in circular motions not back and forth, spit - don't rinse, choose health snacks like fruit, cheese, plain crackers and vegetable sticks, drink water and milk; avoid sugary drinks such as juice and fizzy drinks.
