 - Financial stewardship
 - Building community engagement and support

It's important to note that the board does NOT get involved in the day-to-day running of the school.

Board members (formerly called 'trustees') are active leaders in the school.

The most valuable skills board members bring to the board table are:

- Working well as part of a team.
- Not afraid to ask challenging questions.
 - Have good communication skills.
 - Be connected to their community.

Every three years, schools hold elections, and we have one this September. If you'd like further information about joining our school Board, please contact Simon.





VACANCY: ADMINISTRATION ASSISTANT AND TEACHER AIDE - FIXED TERM 10 HOURS PER WEEK- TERM TIME ONLY

Our amazing, friendly team is looking for someone to fill a dual role at Maungakaramea School. We are looking for an Administration Assistant to help in our busy School Office for 4 hours per week. Main duties include dealing with queries in person, by phone, email and Facebook (including receiving and recording cash and EFTPOS payments); following up unexplained absences and updating attendance registers; collecting and processing mail; entering Ruru fees into Kindo, and checking and fulfilling Kindo orders. Other duties may include checking and replenishing stocks, updating office records and filing systems, and other tasks as they arise. The ideal person will be friendly and welcoming, have previous administrative experience and be a confident computer user.

Tūtaki Talk: On Monday mornings classes get together for Tūtaki Talk. This is an opportunity for students to collectively do Tāumata Time, share sports news from the week prior and talk about anything important coming up. One of the things we do is have a Whakataukī/Maori proverb chosen by Barbie, our LSC, that relates to something we are focussing on or have been reminded about. This week students were reminded about caring for the school property and environment. The whakataukī chosen for this was "He tangata takahi manuhiri, he marae puehu".

COVID-19 is still around, with a new variant now in the NZ community. It is important we remember to be vigilant and test children and whānau when symptoms emerge.
