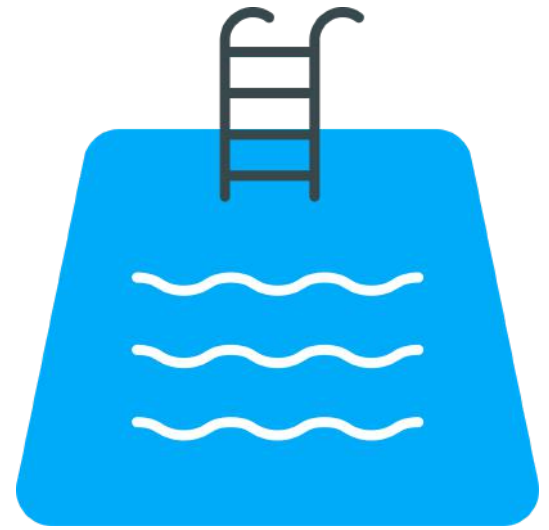
Drink Bottles:
