## SCHOOL POOL


The School Pool is scheduled to be open from Monday 14th November.

#### Newsletter:

For the rest of the term our school newsletter will come out in odd weeks on a Monday.

#### First Day 2023:

Our first day back in 2023 is Thursday 2nd February.

#### **Bring Your Own Device (BYOD):**

School Boards around the country (in fact schools globally), are wrestling with the challenging question of how they meet the demands of the digital age. No matter where we position ourselves on this matter, there are three indisputable facts, digital technologies are becoming a bigger and bigger part of learning (in fact of life), this costs money (quite a bit of money), school communities, by and large, will have to fund this themselves. You may know that many schools have gone BYOD, these schools generally require parents to purchase a device for their children for use at school. We are mindful of the cost of this to families.

This year our Board decided to adopt an **optional BYOD programme. This has been very** successful and for 2023 we will be extending it to Year 4-8 students.

Our device of preference is a Chromebook, however a laptop will work as well.

Please keep an eye out for BYOD pricing from Noel Leeming that we will send out. It may also pay to look at some headphones (which will be needed) and a cover for the chromebook for extra protection.

There is no doubt that the right technologies, used the right way, have real potential to add value to your child's schooling.

#### Some questions you might have:

- **1. Will there be advantages to our child having their own chromebook/laptop?** Yes, we think so. They will have more access and can use these at home. They can also use them for <u>some</u> of their home learning.
- **2. Will my child be disadvantaged if they do not have one?** They will still have access to shared technologies at school.
  - **3.** If my child has their own chromebook/laptop can they use the school devices? Yes, when they need to.
- **4.** If I do not buy them a chromebook/laptop will there be enough school ones to go around? We will do our best, but these will inevitably be shared. We are constantly maintaining our fleet and looking to expand wherever funding allows.
- **5.** Will my child need to purchase programmes for their device if I choose to purchase one? No, everything we will be using them for is online and will be through school email accounts.
- 6. If I can get a chromebook/laptop cheaper than the Noel Leeming offer is this a problem?

  No, go for it.

## 7. Will digital technologies replace the conventional teaching and learning methods that we value and know make a difference?

No. Where possible we will use them in ways that complement and enhance the traditional ways of learning and teaching.

#### 8. Will digital technologies make children less mobile and active?

We recognise the traditional rural feel of Maungakaramea School and its community and understand that there needs to be a balance and that children get plenty of opportunities to run and play and interact.

## 9. Will there be measures to ensure my child's chromebook/laptop is looked after while at school?

We will need to put protocols in place but will do our best. Your child has a part to play here also.

#### **Senior Uniforms**:

This year we introduced a new uniform for our Year 7 and 8 students. This uniform is not compulsory to wear until 2024.

If you would like to order a uniform this needs to be done before the end of this week. Payment is not due until the uniforms arrive.
