been around since those days and for the work/mahi that has gone into changing and strengthening our school for the better.

Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC):

EOTC includes everything from camps, class trips, educational trips to sporting events. With a growing school teachers and I have got together to look at what we would like EOTC to look like going forward.

We have decided on a two year cycle which ensures a balance of opportunities for students moving throughout the school.
