
MGK school sports: Basketball: MGK Marvels lost to Bream Bay Netball:

How it works

Sara Abraham will be sending out a return slip for parents/caregivers of Piwakawaka to fill out. This is where you can tell us who is allowed to collect your child from class. This list will be shared with the office.
Sara will escort Piwakawaka students to bus line.
Lyn will collect After School care students from Piwakawaka before 3pm and escort them to Ruru.
#Please note, if you want your child to be released from class by themselves to go to sports training across the road, you will have a space to let us know on the form.

This is currently not confirmed as negotiating team is working with the Ministry of Education on a solution.
