School Hats:

A reminder that this is a summer term. All students must wear their school hats (no other hats allowed). Students with no school hat must play on the Kākano deck or Monkey Tree.

Zone Swimming Event:

Recently students in Year 5-8 have been involved in time trials for Freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. Students who are able to do the required lengths, without stopping and displaying the correct stroke have their times considered for participation in our Zone event. Our zone includes Maungakaramea, Tauraroa Area, Waiotira and Portland Schools.

If your child is selected to compete in our zone event, you will receive a permission slip home from Carlyn Condon, one of our Sports Coordinators.

What are the Zone and WPSSA Swimming events?

-These are events for the top competitive swimmers from schools to get together and test their skills. These are not designed to be a "have a go" day, like WPSSA events such as Winter Sports.

How were our students selected to go to the zone event at TAS?

- -All year 5-8 students were timed at school in all events, freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke.
- -Students were selected with the main criteria of their time to complete their race, and their skill level in the water.
- -Skill level: In order to be selected to the zone or town event the students must perform the correct stroke perfectly. They are also not allowed to stop and stand up, as the minimum requirement for length is 25m (our pool is 15m, so does require a stand and turn) These rules must be adhered to very closely.

What does the NZ Curriculum expect from schools in terms of teaching children to swim?

- The NZ Curriculum has no expectation that children learn to swim at school, in fact, we are lucky to even have a school pool!
- -The focus of an aquatics lesson is around safety in and around water, especially at the junior level. This is what is taught to teachers and students through water safety instructors from Sport Northland.
- -As we are a Northland school and surrounded by water, we teach our senior students the basic strokes of freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. However if you as a parent are interested in your child competing competitively, we would recommend swimming lessons outside of school.
- -In addition to what we do at school, we also do water related activities such as; surfing, beach trips/education and water based activities on camps.
